KRANJSKA GORA AND PLANICA

For your convenience, we summarize the highlights of the Wikipedia page on Kranjska Gora. First mentions in written sources were

- as Chrainow in 1326,
- as Chrainau and Chrainaw in 1363,
- as Cranaw and Chranaw in 1390, and
- as Kraynaw in 1456–61, among other names.

The Slovene name Kranjska Gora is a reworking of the German name, influenced by German Krainberg 'Karawanks'. The settlement was also called Borovska vas in Slovene in the past.

Kranjska Gora, believed to have been settled by Slovenes from Carantania in the 11th century, served as a fief of the Counts of Ortenburg in the 12th century. In the 14th century, the town boasted a trade route to Tarvisio. The Counts of Celje constructed a castle in Villa Bassa (now part of Tarvisio) in 1431, which remained under the town's jurisdiction until 1848. Kranjska Gora faced an Ottoman attack in 1476. In 1870, a railway connection was established.

Planica, located in a neighboring valley, has gained worldwide renown for its ski jumping heritage. The initial ski jumping hill was constructed prior to 1930 on the slope of Mount Ponca. In 1933, Ivan Rožman undertook the construction of a larger hill, which was later completed in 1934 and became known as the Bloudek Giant (Bloudkova velikanka) in honor of Stanko Bloudek. This hill played a pivotal role in the development of ski flying as the largest jumping hill in the world at that time. Notably, in 1936, Sepp Bradl achieved the first-ever ski jump over 100 meters (330 ft) at this hill. Fast forward to 1969, the Gorišek Brothers Flying Hill (Letalnica

bratov Gorišek), the K185 hill was built by Vlado and Janez Gorišek.
